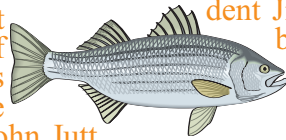

# FISHING BULLETIN

We are now into our fall fishing season and the weather has been on our side. Lets hope that Mother Nature can keep the same in check and allow our club boats the window of weather they need to make the off-shore trek wherever their destinations may be. The action has been picking up on the offshore scene. The action from Hudson to Lindenkohl has been fairly consistent. The action was starting to shift from trolling to chunking as the fish settle in to feed heavily prior to their migration south to their winter hibernating grounds. That changed about two weeks ago when there was an excellent troll bite in the Hudson Canyon. The Mickey Likes It, Aphis and Hooker scored big on the Yellowfin and Longfin. The fish were all decent with the yellows in the 50-70lb range and the longfin in the 40-50 lb range. They also all reported a fair amount of Mahi up to 22lbs were taken from underneath the pots on the east side. The bluefin action looked like it was going to heat up nicely, however not to the expectations of the anglers who participated in last year's fishery. On his first real offshore jaunt on the newly repowered Bunker Dunker, Captain John Jutt showed his crew the way to land bluefin. After a few fishless drifts, John came off of the wheel and within moments hooked up and landed a 100lb bluefin. The Wasabi has also cashed in on this action, during the same rodeo weekend he and his crew made a stop on the way in and landed two bluefins keeping there limit up to 90lbs. as well.



Shark fishing has not started up as of this writing. The areas waters from the twenty-mile wrecks to the Virginia have been infested with schools upon schools of spiny dogfish. History has shown us that this is the time of the year when the fall migration starts. This might have to be pushed out further into the season as the water temps are still above normal. For those of us who are really interested in this fishery this time of year brings in some of the seasons best.

Bluefishing continues to be non-stop. A trip to 17 Fathoms or to the Mud Buoy is all it takes to load up. On a recent trip aboard the Day Tripper, skippered by John Price, we limited out on fish up to 10lbs. and left them biting when we ran out of chum.

Striped Bass action has started to pick up. Paul Hilton aboard the Emily S, accompanied by John Jutt and Joe Jahn made a local trip and were able to cull out a few fish from underneath the marauding blues that were prevalent that night. The bass action from our eastern crew has been very strong as well. Recently past president Jim Krug nailed a 41lber, while employing live bait on a not so nice family outing.

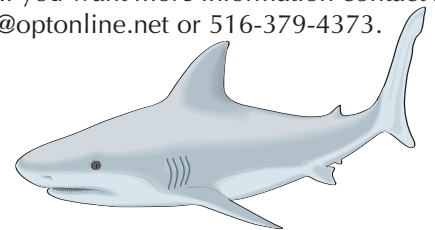
## SHOOT OUT

## THESE ARE THE MOST CURRENT FISHING REGULATIONS FOR NEW YORK STATE

1. BLACKFISH: 14' size limit 10 bag limit open till 5-31-06
2. PORGIES: 10 1/2 size limit 25 bag limit 60 in bag on head boat open till 10-31
3. SEA BASS; 12' size limit, 25 bag limit open till 11-30-05
4. BLUEFISH: 15 fish open all year only 10 fish may be under 12 inches
5. WEAKFISH: 15 fish open all year only 10 fish may be under 12 inches
6. FLOUNDER: CLOSED TILL NEXT SPRING
7. FLUKE: 17 1/2 size limit 5 fish bag limit open till 10-31
8. SHARK 1 per boat

## ROGUE WAVES

Also worth noting are the rogue waves that have occasionally appeared off our Atlantic Coast. Back in June, two fishermen were returning from a tuna and wahoo tournament in the Bahamas around the time of Hurricane Arlene. NOAA has predicted 4-6 seas so they headed back to Ft Pierce in Florida, 31 miles offshore. Out of nowhere two gigantic waves swamped the 34 foot powerboat within seconds! They just had time to activate the EPIRB and grab lifejackets as water poured into the boat. Another incident occurred when the cruise ship, Norwegian Dawn was hit by 70 foot high waves off the coast of North Carolina knocking out windows and flooding 62 cabins. Possession and activation of an EPIRB is essential when going offshore. A program Called AMVER (Assistance Vessel Rescue System) is sponsored by the Coast Guard, and is a unique computer based , voluntary global ship reporting system. The CG provides locations of ships athat are near vessels in distress and asks them to assist in search and rescue ops. Today, there are near 12,000 ships from over 140 nations participate in AMVER worldwide. Over 128 lives were saved in 2004 alone.
