Seminar: What's Going on with Striped Bass? (30 min, plus questions)

At the next General Meeting on May 9th, **Capt. John McMurray of ONE MORE CAST CHARTERS, INC.** will be discussing what's causing the super abundance of Striped Bass in our local fishery. **Topics include:** bait and bass migration patterns, why the slot limit remains so restrictive, the future of bass in our local fishery, and some top water tactics.

Captain McMurray served in the U.S. Coast Guard as a smallboat coxswain and marine-fisheries law enforcement officer. Thereafter, he was the Executive Director of the Coastal Conservation Association New York, a non-profit recreational fishing conservation and advocacy group. For 16 years he served as the Director of Grants Programs at the Norcross Wildlife Foundation in New York, which had distributed over \$20 million in conservation grants, much of it directly targeted for protection of marine fish and habitat.

For the last two decades Capt. McMurray has been the owner and primary operator of ONE MORE CAST CHARTERS, INC., where he runs trips on skiffs and Contenders, nearly every day the weather allows, from mid-April through December – with the exception of every other Sunday, which he sets aside to take his son and his friends fishing (AKA "Bro-day"). If you would like to book a trip with Capt. McMurray, the details are on his website at **nyctuna.com**
